

Why visit Polesworth Abbey?

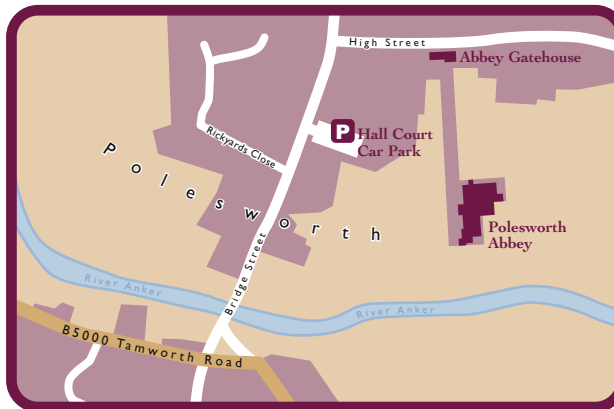
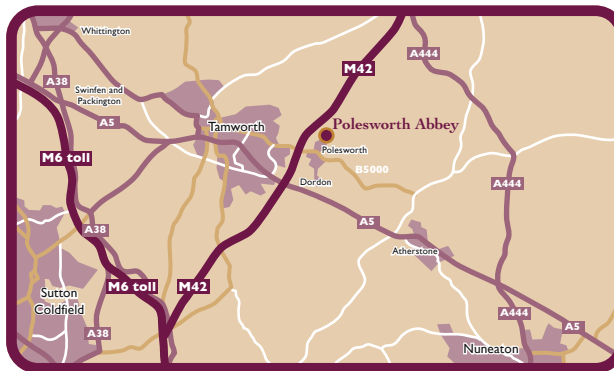
Polesworth Abbey has been a place of welcome since Saxon times. Established almost twelve-hundred years ago, this is a place of prayer, where local people welcome visitors and share the wonder of this long heritage with you. Walk in the restored remains of a mediaeval Cloister and the Sensory Garden on the site of Abbey buildings. Explore and discover the Abbey Church and grounds with our attractive Family Trails. Enjoy the hospitality of the Fairtrade Refectory, tea and coffee available. View the audio-visual presentations of the Abbey's history and the conservation of the Gatehouse. See the links with William Shakespeare and follow Polesworth's unique poetry trail.

The Abbey is open every day (except Monday) from 11am to 4pm (Tuesday to Friday). Saturday 10.30am to 1pm and Sunday 2pm to 4pm. Guided tours of the 14C Abbey Gatehouse take place on Wednesday afternoon from 2:00pm and Saturday morning from 11:30am. Please phone or email to book using our contact details. Group bookings can be arranged at other times by appointment.

There is a Fairtrade shop and gift shop. Refreshments are available on site. Access and parking for the disabled near the Church and Refectory.

How to Find Us

The village of Polesworth lies to the East of Tamworth on the B5000, within easy reach of the M42, the A5, and the A444. The Abbey itself is off the High Street and the Gatehouse can be clearly seen on the right as you head North through the village. Parking is available in Hall Court on Bridge Street, satellite navigation reference: B78 1DT.
